The exhibition, Strategies for Representation, is New York based artist, Matt Wycoff's third solo show in Kansas City and his first at Dolphin. Produced during a three month residency at the Bemis foundation in Omaha, this body of work represents on-going series of conceptual projects that filter a wide array of subjects or themes through his own personal experiences or through simple, sometimes exhaustive, processes in which his activity accumulates multiple possible meanings through repetition. Wycoff strips down romantic, historically, or emotionally charged content into often reductive visual elements that create a tension between actual human emotions and situations, and the various ways we represent and understand those experiences. "Strategies," is a continuation of this larger body of work with a focus on the idea of representation itself, and the various over-lapping patterns and methods of representation present at all levels of human activity
